

Gogoi ready for cabinet rejig



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Chief minister Tarun Gogoi pulls up his sleeves for cabinet [rejig](#). Gogoi is believed to have received [green](#) signal for the party high command.

Sources told Assam Times that the chief minister would drop around 9 cabinet colleagues to induct 12 others. Proadyut Bordoloi, Rockybul Hussain, [Ajanta](#) Neog are among seven others who have been spared. Akon [Bora](#), Nazrul Islam, Prithvi Majhi, Tanka Bahadur Rai, Kharsng Ingty are among the losers in the soon to be reshuffled cabinet.

The chief minister is unlikely to induct his trusted Anjan Dutta who is likely to replace APCC president Bhubneswar Kalita. Bhupen [Bora](#), Sarat Borkotoky, Bidya Singh Englang, [Chandan](#) Sarkar, Debobrata Saikia, Arun Kumar Bhuyan are expected to be inducted in the cabinet.

Three prominent posts have been lying since Dr Himanta Biswa Sarma resigned refusing to work under Tarun Gogoi as chief minister, Siddiqu Ali Ahmed, Dr Ardhendu Dey were dropped for doing dissidence and [Chandan](#) Brahma resigned after BPF parted ways with [Congress](#).

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
