The Nation [Seminar](#) on 'Human Rights and Global Challenges' was organized by Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Guwahati College in collaboration with UNESCO on 20th & 21st May 2017. The inaugural function was presided [over](#) by Dr. Arati Bairagee, Coordinator (IQAC), Guwahati College and was attended by the Guest of Honour, Dr. Aswini Kr. Sharma, Executive Director, United Nations Resource Centre, Dr. Udayon Misra, Former HoD, Department of English, Dibrugarh University, Dr. Pranab Sandilya, [Principal](#), Guwahati College and many other delegates and research scholars coming from different Institute, University and NGOs.

Dr. Udayon Misra in his keynote address spoke about the greatest challenge ever faced by an individual is the poverty. To overcome this there has to be justice which could be achieved if there is equal distribution of opportunities and wealth. Dr. Misra also stresses on two milestones in the history of Human Rights and Challenges. Firstly, about the American War of Independence and secondly he discussed about the Atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki and its effects thereafter. Dr. Aswini Kr. Sharma on the other hand elaborated more on the regional problems and issues and how Human Rights are affected in the process.

The [Principal](#) and Chairman, Dr. Pranab Sandilya said that there were 270 papers coming from around the country who are eminent academicians, research scholars, experts and students from various disciplines. The paper contribution for the seminar are from the [state](#) of Karnataka, Maharashtra, [Nagaland](#), [Meghalaya](#), [Tripura](#), [Arunachal Pradesh](#), Sikkim, West Bengal, [New Delhi](#), Assam and also from International Academicians and Experts like Nigeria, Kenya and Pakistan.

In the seminar various subjects based on the theme of Human Right brought together crucial topics like curricular aspects of higher education, the role and importance of education, in academic administration, environmental protection, role of media, IT, women studies, [rights](#) of differently abled person, feminism, films, political [rights](#) in higher education, role of NGOs, economic [rights](#) etc were discussed.
