

HC to hear PIL against APSC on Aug 14



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The Gauhati High Court has asked the Assam Public Service Commission to submit the details of the last civil service examination conducted to select candidates for ACS, APS and allied services.

Admitting a [PIL](#) by Akhil Gogoi on Thursday, a division bench of the court issued the directive to the commission asking to submit the details of the marks on August [10](#), obtained by the candidates in the controversial examination. The court will hear the [PIL](#) on August 14.

It further asked the [chief](#) secretary to clear its position on the same day. Notably, the KMSS [leader](#) moved the court alleging rampant corruption in the selection of candidates for ACS, APS and allied services.

He accused sitting chairman Rakesh [Paul](#) of resorting to bribery for selecting a section of candidates where the eligible candidates were deprived.

He targeted [chief](#) minister [Tarun Gogoi](#) for allowing [Paul](#) to ravage APSC with corruption. In his [PIL](#), Gogoi sought court's intervention [against](#) the state public service commission and cancellation of the selected candidates in question.
