

Initial respite for Kaziranga



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The [flood](#) fury in the [Kaziranga](#) National Park seems to have showing a receding trend on Tuesday. Twenty percent of the entire national park is now free for the animals to stay.

The animals and birds to have shifted to the [Karbi hills](#) at the height of the fury are expected to be return.

But many areas of the park are still inaccessible despite a drop in the water level. Park authorities told [Assam](#) Times that that proper extent of damages would be assessed later.

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
