

LPG pipeline blast in Moranhat

RHISHAV GOGOI, MORANHAT: At least three people died and over [30](#) others sustained critical injury when an Oil India Limited-owned gas pipeline exploded in [Moran](#) along the [Sivasagar](#)-Dibrugarh inter district [border](#) on Monday.

The incident, which took place under mysterious circumstances, took place at noon leaving a massive [fire](#) in the area.

Over [50](#) houses were reduced to ashes within an hour. Twenty [fire](#) tenders from Dibrugarh and [Sivasagar](#) have been trying to bring the situation under control.

Oil India Limited authorities told [Assam](#) Times that the reason is yet to be known. Nobody has so far claimed the responsibility. The [injured](#) have been rushed to [Assam](#) Medical [College](#) Hospital in Dibrugarh.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
