

Maha Rally seeking Bodoland in Parliament Street



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The All Bodo Students Union (ABSU), [National](#) Democratic Front of Boroland (P) and Peoples Joint Action Committee for Boroland Movement (PJACBM) carried out a Maha [Rally](#) in [New Delhi](#) on Tuesday with traditional [community](#) attire, beginning from Rajghat to Jantar Mantar via [Parliament](#) Street on demand of Bodoland and political right to the Bodos living outside the proposed Bodoland area.

Thousands of [student](#) activists and supporters from different organizations joined hands with banner, placards in the Maha [Rally](#) and shouted slogans demanding early creation and solving of long standing pending demand of separate Bodoland issue through political dialogue.
