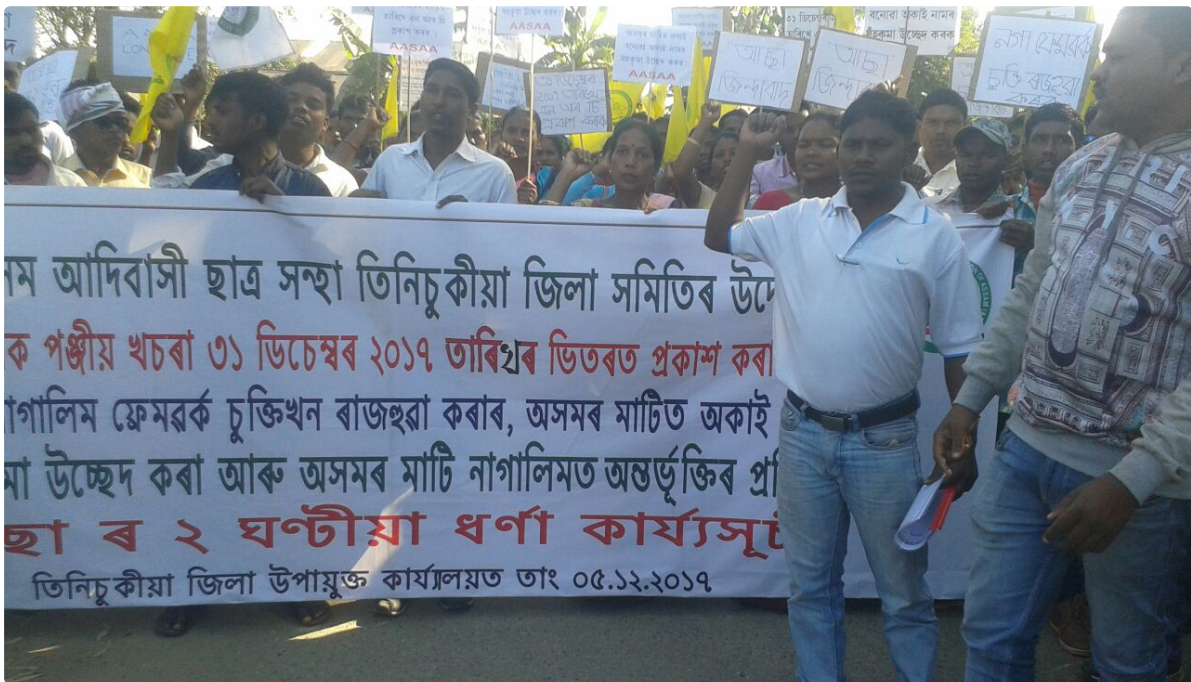


Make public Naga peace pact: AASSA to PM



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TINSUKIA: The All [Adivasi](#) Students Association of Assam ([AASSAA](#)) staged sit in for two hours in [Tinsukia](#) demanding that the Centre must make public the Naga peace framework to allay the apprehension of the [state](#)'s territorial integration.

Talking to Assam Times, AASSA president Raja Kujur, General Secretary Ramanuj Lakra said the silence of the Assam Government [over](#) the recent [Nagaland](#) sub division on the soil of Assam, deterioration of law and order situation along the Assam-[Nagaland](#) border have raised [doubt over](#) the role of the Government at the Centre and [state](#).

They made it clear that the Government would be responsible for any untoward incident if takes place after the announcement of the greater Nagalim. Later they sent a memorandum to the Prime Minister through the Deputy Commissioner raising their [demands](#).
