

Manipur students support Assam stir



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A prominent student organization from [Manipur](#) has confirmed their support to the proposed massive agitation in Assam [against](#) the Centre's decision to allow Bangladeshi and Pakistani refugees to stay in [India as](#) refugees which will force Assam to bear an extra burden of more than 20 lakh outsiders.

Talking to Assam Talks, the [leaders](#) of the Democratic Students Alliance of [Manipur](#) said that they would extend all support to the people of Assam in the massive agitation [against](#) the Centre's move. DSAM also supported the recent 12-hour Assam [bandh](#).

DSAM [leaders](#) observed that the refugee move would disrupt the demography in the entire north eastern region. They said that the [indigenous](#) people of the north east should unitedly go all out [against](#) the Centre. "Mount pressure on the centre to withdraw the decision.
