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Water levels of the river [Brahmaputra](#) and its tributaries [start](#) receding. But the [level](#) of misery of the flood-hit people keeps surging on every passing day.

The flood [waters](#) in many areas have gone following the halt of the paralyzing rains. But the affected people have yet to go back [as](#) they are yet to get out of the blues.
