The 12th South Asian Games, [2016](#) to be held in Guwahati and Shillong from 5th to 16th February is already creating lots of vibes - not just across the region or the host states, but also in the country [as](#) a whole. Dubbed [as](#) the biggest ever sporting extravaganza of the region, the two host cities Guwahati and Shillong are leaving no stone unturned to make the event a grand [success](#). The entire 12-day event will witness a large contingent of international athletes from eight participating nations battling [against](#) each other to establish their supremacy in 23 different sporting disciplines.
