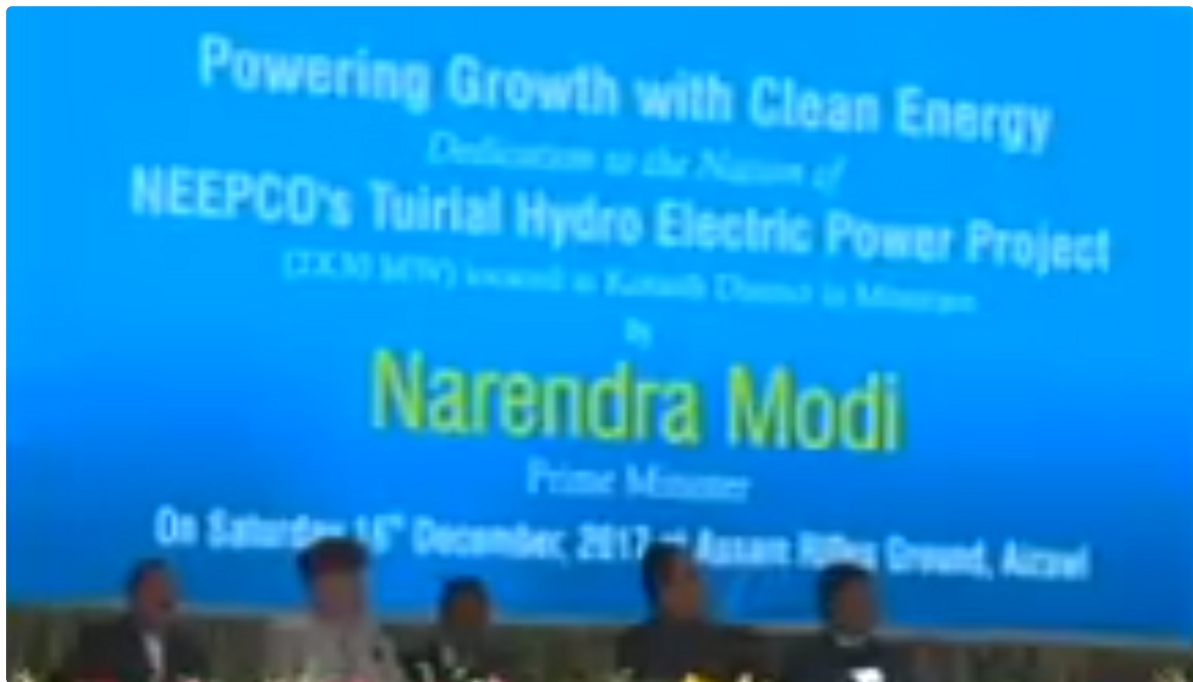


Modi opens power project in Aiazwl



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AIAZWL:Mizoram has received a huge boost on it's power from after prime minister [Narendra Modi](#) opened the NEEPCO owned Tuitial Hydro Electric Power project in Aiazwl on Saturday.
