

Mrinal Hazarika says they announced ceasefire but will not surrender



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Top ranked ULFA cadre of the 28th battalion, now in ceasefire namely Mrinal Hazarika and his aide Jun Bhuyan are camping in the city as part of their mission to carry forward the peace process. They are holding talks with various political parties, organizations and individuals seeking their advice and opinions.
