

Muslim bodies not to tolerate any harassment: Omar



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Three minority bodies in Assam on Wednesday warned that they will not tolerate any harassment on the Muslim people in the name of detecting and deporting the Bangladeshi immigrants in Assam.

The Muslim organizations have strongly criticized the Asom Jatiyatabadi Yuva Chatra Parishad for the recent demonstration by the in the city against the illegal Bangladeshi people.

Addressing a press conference in the city on Wednesday, the Muslim council leaders Omar Rashid and Mustafa Kamal have alleged that the AJYCP people in protest have singled out the Muslim people only.

They questioned AASU and AJYCP on what basis they have detected the Bangladeshi immigrants. They have also questioned the government's role on detecting and deporting the Bangladeshis.

Further, they came down heavily on the Asom Gana Parishad and asked the regional party leaders why they were remaining silent while they were in power.
