Nabajit Das, Lecturer of Zoology of B.H. College, Howly, Barpeta recently participated in the 23rd Biennial congress of International Primatological Society (IPS) held from September 12-18 at Kyoto University, Kyoto, Japan. He attended the congress on invitation from the IPS to present on "Status & conservation of Bengal Slow Loris (*Nycticebus Bengalensis*) in the north-east India".
