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A 22 member team, comprising 20 students and two teacher guides from different Higher Secondary [Schools](#) in Kokrajhar district is on the way to Mumbai,Pune and [Goa](#) by train for national integration tour(NIT) under the part of Operation Sadbhavana of the red horn division of Indian army to pave way students knowledge building in their future life in the country.
