RS Chauhan (IPS) took [over as](#) new Superintendent of Police for East [Siang](#) District on November 20. Chauhan hails from Uttar Pradesh started his [career](#) in police service in 1988 [as](#) ACP at Delhi. Before joining [as](#) SP East [Siang](#), he served the [state as](#) AIGP (Modernization) at PHQ, [Itanagar](#).
