

No let-up in flood woes



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There is no let-up in the [flood](#) fury that has claimed 7 lives apart from rendered over ten lakh people in fifteen districts homeless during this week.

The Brahmaputra and its tributaries are still flowing above the danger level even after the halt in the incessant [rains](#) in Arunachal Pradesh.

The waterlevels in the mighty river are on the rise at Nematighat, [Dhubri](#) and Dibrugarh. Same it is in the cases of the river Jai Bharali in [Sonitpur](#), Kopili in Kamrup and [Beki](#) in [Barpeta](#) districts.

Altogether [15](#) districts — [Dhemaji](#), Jorhat, Dibrugarh, [Golaghat](#), [Sivasagar](#), [Sonitpur](#), [Lakhimpur](#), Nalbari, [Barpeta](#), Bongaigaon, [Morigaon](#), Kamrup, [Dhubri](#), [Kokrajhar](#) and [Karbi](#) Anglong have been affected by the [flood](#).

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
