

No mercy for arrested ACS-APS officers



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GUWAHATI: The Gauhati High Court has reserved its ruling on the bail petitions moved by 19 ACS and APS officers who were arrested in the APSC cash for jobs scam. A bench of Justice Rumi Kumari Phukan heard the bail petitions on Friday and reserved the ruling. The ruling is expected in a day or two. All of these officers have been sent to jail after the end of the police remand.

The court further heard the anticipatory bail [petition](#) of Nishamoni Deka who has been absconding since the police [launched](#) the massive drive against these ACS and APS officers. The Supreme Court has already rejected the anticipatory bail plea.

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
