

No reason to be worried over NRC



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NEW DELHI: Union home minister Rajnath Singh said no Indian living in Assam would be left out in the updated NRC in Assam.

Replying to Saugata [Roy](#) of Trinamool [Congress](#) in [Parliament](#) on Thursday, Singh said process is on to update NRC in the north eastern [state](#) under the direct supervision of the Supreme Court.

Singh was responding to [Roy](#) who alleged that NRC is a conspiracy in Assam against the Bangla speaking people in the [state](#).
