

No respite from armyworms



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Despite stepped up measures, the armyworms [menace](#) in the crops fields in Assam refuses to die down. The [menace](#) keeps spreading to more and more areas much to the major disappointment of the farming [community](#) who [fear](#) a feminine-like situation in the [state](#).

Now altogether 22 districts have been grappling with the [menace](#) forcing the government to step up measures to [deal](#) with the situation where crops on more than 31, 000 hectares land have been damaged. The worst-hit district is Golaghat which is followed by Majuli apart from Dibrugarh, Jorhat, Sivasagar. The newly affected districts include Charaideo, Darrang, Nagaon, [Morigaon](#), Kamrup, Sonitpur, Dhemaji and Biswanath.

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
