

NSD repertory plays in Guwahati



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The repertory company of [National](#) School of Drama (NSD), [New Delhi](#) will stage five plays in the [city](#) starting from Thursday (19 January). The plays, to be performed at Shrimanta Shankardev Kalakhetra, will [start](#) every evening at [6](#) pm.

Well known plays including Ghasiram Katowal, Gajab Teri Ada, Lagi Lagan, Adha Chand and Tajmahal Ka Tender will be staged accordingly. The NSD repertory chef Suresh Sarma, while talking to the media persons at Guwahati Press Club on Tuesday, informed that there is no entry fees. Sarma expected good number of theatre audience in all the shows, however requested to avoid below five year babies with them. The repertory team, comprising 20 performers, has already staged all these plays at Tezpur, Dergaon, [Tinsukia](#) and Dibrugarh recently and received applause from the theatre goers. The team also includes four [Assamese](#) actors.
