

## Pair of baby Himalayan bear rescued in Udalguri

Patrolling teams of [Mazbat](#) forest Range Office, under Dhansiri Forest Division, [Udalguri](#) and Army stationed at [Mazbat](#) successfully [rescued](#) an endangered pair of baby Himalayan bear calves recently near Assam-[Arunachal](#) border. According to MK Sarma, DFO, Dhansiri Forest Division, [Udalguri](#), forest patrolling team headed by Mintu Boro [rescued](#) a pair of two months old baby Himalayan bear from the house of an [Adivasi](#) wood cutter in No. [10](#) Nala Dalanibasti village in No. [2](#) Dhansiri tea garden in the night of May 15. According to the wood cutter, he had [found](#) the pair at No. [10](#) Nadi in the afternoon of that day. [Wildlife](#) lovers alleged that the wood cutter had captured the pair for selling to poachers at higher prices. The calves were later handed [over](#) to Dr. Brindavan Phangcho, head of a team of experts from WTI (Rescue and Rehabilitation Centre), Chakrasila, Kokrajhar in the night of May 18 in sound health for further care and nursing.
