

Panic over ULFA ban

Panic grips the Hindi-speaking people a day after [ULFA](#) imposed ban on two groups for refusing to tender apology on the charges it levelled on the [Tinsukia](#) trader killing.

Talking to Assam Times in [Tinsukia](#), Anit Yadav said, “we are shocked to have heard the ban imposed by [ULFA](#). We have been living in Assam for the last several decades. We don’t understand why Baruah targetted us.”

Putul Prasad, who is a teacher by profession told Assam Times that “we need to live in peace and we should not allow others to be disturbed.”

“We will urge Paresh Baruah for a second thought,” said Rabi Shankar [Das](#) who was among those to oppose the killing of the [Tinsukia](#) trader.

Meanwhile district administration have asked the Hindi speaking people not to be panic saying that the authority is committed to protect the lives and property of all sections of the people.

NAZIRA, September 27, 2026 — Tension continues to prevail in Nazira, particularly in the Santak-Bihubar area, following the killing of Biman Barua, president of the Rangajan Yuva Samaj and a youth social worker, on September 18 under Bihubar Police Station.

Following the killing, local residents have been demanding stringent punishment for the alleged masterminds, Ravindra Singh alias Vicky Singh and Rubul Khan, besides seeking demolition of Vicky Singh's residence.

Meanwhile, Sivasagar district police have taken Vicky Singh and Rubul Khan into custody and are questioning them at the district headquarters police station in connection with the murder case and allegations of drug-related activities.

According to police sources, the two allegedly told investigators during questioning that drugs were brought from Dimapur and Nagaland and stored at the residence of Vicky Singh's sister in Nazira town. The drugs were allegedly supplied from the house to users in different parts of Nazira and Sivasagar.

Based on the information allegedly obtained during the questioning, a joint team of Bihubar Police and Nazira Model Police Station conducted a raid at the residence of Vicky Singh's sister, Rinki Singh Bora, in Ward No. 6 of Nazira town on Saturday morning.

Police detained Rinki Singh Bora and are reportedly questioning her in connection with the alleged storage and distribution of drugs.

The investigation into the murder of Biman Barua and the alleged drug network is continuing.
