

Paralyzing bandh in Barak



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Normal life comes to a grinding halt in Barak valley districts on Friday following the 12 hour [bandh](#) in protest [against](#) the [arrest](#) of Siddique Ali Ahmed.

Vehicles are not plying on the roads from [6](#) in the morning while the businessmen down their shutters till [6](#) in the evening.

The former minister's supporters, in large numbers, came out to the roads to enforce the [bandh](#). There is no report of any untoward incident during the [bandh](#) hours.

The former minister from Karimganj was sent to jail in an assault case on Thursday triggering clash of police and his supporters.

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
