

Paralyzing bandh in Golaghat



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GOLAGHAT: Normal life remained totally paralyzed on Thursday under the impact of a day long [bandh](#) call by a tea garden [student](#) organization demanding death sentence of two tea garden owners who shot at six [workers](#) for demanding wages.

Roads in the tea rich district remained deserted as vehicles refused to play after the organizers enforced the [bandh](#). Shops and markets, schools and colleges, offices and banks remained closed for the day.

Bandh supporters in many places blocked the [National](#) Highway for several hours causing immense inconvenience for the passengers.

A huge traffic snarl disrupted surface communication on the [National](#) Highway No 37 in Bokakhat where more than 5000 tea garden [workers](#) blocked the vital road demanding capital punishment for the tea garden owners.

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
