

Paralyzing bandh in Tinsukia



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Normal life comes to a grinding halt in [Tinsukia](#) district on Thursday following the 12 hour [bandh](#) in protest [against](#) the incident at Bijuliban where [ULFA](#) men shot dead a businessman and his daughter on Tuesday night.

Vehicles are off from the roads. Shops and markets, schools and colleges, banks and offices are remaining closed under the impact of the [bandh](#) called by the Bhujpuri students union.

Security forces are patrolling on the streets to avert any untoward incident in the district during the [bandh](#) hours.

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
