

PIL deadlock: SC judges to meet on Tuesday

The Supreme Court will devise a mechanism to end the [PIL](#) logjam in the Gauhati High on Tuesday. Senior Judges of the apex court are expected to participate in the meeting.

They include Justice [Ranjan](#) Gagoi, Justice A.M. Sapre and Justice Amitabh [Roy](#) who will deliberate on the contents of the memorandum in question and to take remedial measures. The striking lawyers came to know it when a Bar Association delegation met Chief Justice of India HL Dattu at his residence in [New Delhi](#) on Sunday.

Led by Gauhati High Court Bar Association president Apurba Kumar Sharma, the delegation was assured that the CJI would look into the grievances mentioned in the memorandum, describing them [as](#) serious, which and needs immediate redressal.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.



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
