

Poachers killed in Kaziranga gunbattle

Forest guards have killed three dreaded poachers at an encounter in [Kaziranga](#) on Wednesday after the national park lost four rhinos during the last 13 days.

The encounter took place at Burhapahar range of the world heritage site in the wee hours. [Kaziranga](#) authorities told Assam Times that the gun battle erupted in the wee hours when the forest guards spotted the armed poachers inside the park.

Forest guards have further recovered arms from the encounter site. Notably, poachers have killed four one horn animals just within a short spell of time.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrrwmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
