

Railway flyover in Kampur



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NAGAON: Union Minister of State for Railways Rajen Gohain laid the foundation stone of a railway [flyover](#) at Kampur railway gate by pressing a remote from Kampur Railway station in the Nagaon district on Friday. The bridge will be built at an estimated cost of Rs. 40.00 crore.

Speaking on the occasion, he said that the Construction work is expected to begin within the next 3 months and that once work is completed, the people of Kampur area will be free of impediments.

Gohain also said that the infrastructure of Kampur Railway station will also be developed [soon](#).
