

Rhino strikes terror: 1 killed in Majuli



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JORHAT: A strayed rhino from [Kaziranga](#) strikes no less terror in Majuli killing an old man in the river island on Monday.

The full grown animal which came out of the [National](#) Park two days back attacked Baloram [Das](#) at his house premises in the Bhakat Chapori area early in the morning.

Local residents told www.assamtimes.org that as the 80 year old who came out of his house early in the morning countered the animal which attacked him in the houseyard. A critically injured Baloram was then rushed to the hospital in critical condition and died a couple of hours later.

Forest [guards](#) have been trying to drive out the one horn animal to the national park. But they find it quite difficult to control it.

The local residents have blamed the forest department for failing to rein in the situation. " Four days have passed since we spotted the animal. The forest [guards](#) have come. But I [don](#)'t understand why they can't drive away the animal from this human habitat," said [Jatin](#) Kalita, a local resident.

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
