Cracks appeared in the Religious Minority Council(RMC),BTC region [over](#) the issue of supporting to the Bodoland Peoples Front(BPF) party in the ensuing Assam assembly election.The [rift](#) appeared in the council after president Sohrab Khan announced openly that RMC leaves to support the BPF party in the election.

Speaking the reporters on Friday at Kokrajhar Press Club, Rijaul Haque Sarkar, general secretary of the RMC told that the council has not been left the BPF party. The reaction come after the Khan addressed the reporters at Kajalgaon in Chirang district on Thursday that RMC announced to leave the ruling party ahead assembly election. Sarkar has denied the statement of Sohrab said that it was his personal view, not of council decision to leave the ruling party in the region.

‘We have no any decision to leave the ruling BPF party at this juncture’, Sarkar adding said that the council still good term with the party and no any decision to step [against](#) ruling party.
