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Hundreds of people from Assam are leaving for Nepal in search of their near and dear ones who have been remaining traceless after the massive strike that rocked the Himalayan kingdom.

Over 3000 people are leaving for Kathmandu by bus and train to seek their relatives, mostly of whom went for eye treatment.
