

SC breather for Nabam Tuki



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Much to the respite of [Nabam](#) Tuki, the Supreme Court on Monday refused to clear a Gauhati High Court's order for CBI probe into a [10](#) year old allegation [against](#) the Chief Minister. The apex court, however, will hear the plea on November 16.

The Gauhati High Court ordered a CBI probe [against](#) Tuki on August 21 into allegations abusing his official position [as](#) PWD minister in awarding vital contracts to his relatives without inviting tenders. Tuki had challenged the order by filing a special leave [petition](#) later in the Supreme Court, which stayed the high court ruling. The case will be heard again on November 16.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
