The entire township broke in to a sea of humanity on Friday when AASU organized a traditional fuction in the pilgrim township.

Local residents made a [2](#) KM long queue on both sides of the road when a huge cultural procession passed off peacefully in the morning.

Organized by the local AASU unit, the colourful troupe began from Puwamokka, the most visited shrine for the Hindus and Muslims and ended at the [Madhav temple](#) premises to be joined by thousand others who visited the ancient [temple](#) on the first days of the festive month in the Assamese calendar.
