North East is full of sports talents. But the talents are lying unexplored to a great extent. The proposed sports varsity ([/taxonomy/term/1693](#)) in Manipur ([/taxonomy/term/64](#)) would go a long way to bridge the gap. It would be a huge boost to the field of north east sports.

This was more or less of what speakers after speakers said at a seminar in Imphal ([/taxonomy/term/72](#)) on Saturday. Organized jointly by Indian Chamber of Commerce, North Eastern Council, Department of Youth Affairs and Sports ([/taxonomy/term/34](#)), the North East Sports ([/taxonomy/term/34](#)) Conclave focused on infrastructure development, training ([/taxonomy/term/1605](#)), challenges and opportunities .

ICC Regional Director Ishantor Sobhapandit urged the industry to invest on sports and sportsperson and the national Sports (/taxonomy/term/34) University should bring investment in terms of manufacturing sports goods and utilities. In his keynote address sports director N Ashok Kumar said there has been clamor for sports as subject in school curriculum and it is a welcome move to have a National (/taxonomy/term/1874) Sports (/taxonomy/term/34) University in the state.

Former hockey captain Bharat Chetri said the North East is the power house of sports map and that the region should have comprehensive region focused sports policy that would address issues like fixed remuneration to the athletes who represent their state and country in various events.

NEC secretary Ameising Luikham said the scope and optimize opportunities that sports offer so that the talented youth of the region should be explored to take up sports as an alternative career option.

Manipur (/taxonomy/term/64) Parliamentary Secretary Mairambam Prithviraj Singh laid stress on taking up sports by youths to physically and mentally fit to build a healthy and productive nation and expressed his gratitude to Govt. of India's decision to establish National (/taxonomy/term/1874) Sports (/taxonomy/term/34) University in Imphal (/taxonomy/term/72).
