

Summit on child labourers in tea plantation



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Top lawyers, tea planers, bureaucrats and social activists are rubbing their shoulders in Guwahati when the premier north eastern [city](#) is hosting a national seminar on the implementation of a vital law by the tea planters.

Jointly organized by [National](#) Law University in Assam and the Assam government on November 14 and 15 at the Administrative Staff College in [Khanapara](#), the seminar is expected discuss in detail a slew of measures to protect child [rights](#) in the tea plantation industry in the tea rich north eastern [state](#).

To be participated by all relevant stakeholders from Assam along with Kerala, Tamil Nadu, [Tripura](#) and West Bengal, the conference will develop a shared understanding of the provisions relating to children in The [Plantation](#) Labour [Act](#), 1951.

The two day event is expected to discuss the issues and challenges faced by key stakeholders in realizing the [rights](#) of the child [as](#) provided under the [PLA](#), 1951.

The experts in the conference are set to prepare some recommendations for better implementation and amendment of the [Plantation Act](#), 1951.

The [chief inspector](#) of plantations along with labour commissioner, chairperson of the from State Commission for Protection of Child Rights, representatives from State Child Protection Society, tea worker [leaders](#) [NGO workers](#), tea producers have confirmed their participation in the conference.

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
