MARGHERITA: The Asom Sangrami Chah Shramik Sangha affiliated to CPI(ML) Panitola Circle Committee on Tuesday submitted a memorandum to the Chief Minister through the [Tinsukia](#) District Deputy Commissioner to increase the daily wages of tea [workers](#) to Rs 350.
