In yet another incident of violence on NE people a youth of [state](#) was brutally killed by miscreants at Bhatni station of Uttar Pradesh on night of February 21 at about 9 in the morning. The deceased Ramen Boro (35), son of Langhidhar Boro of Malmura village, [Tangla](#) was working in Mumbai. He boarded a home bound train on February 20 when he was brutally killed by miscreants at Bhatni station in Uttar Pradesh.

Ramen had left for Mumbai three months back to work in a private firm. Ramen was in touch with his family member until an hour back of the incident. Railway Police of Bhatni Railway station informed the friends and family members of the victim with Ramen's mobile.

The incident has raised the question about the much vaunted improved law and order situation in North [India](#) and crimes of hatred on NE people.
