

Three buses seized

Three passenger buses were detected by sale taxes official and staffs in a search operation along the 31C national high way this morning at [Patgaon](#) in Kokrajhar district today. The buses carrying dry supery ceating government taxes for Siliguri of West Be from Guwahati.

The three buses which were on way for Siliguri carried dry supery ceating govt taxes bearing registrations-AS01BC-8292, AS01CC-4622, AS01Q-0045.

Sale taxes officials seized buses along with 150 packets of dry supery (each packet carries 50 kgs) and market value would be about 30-35 lakhs.

Dipen [Das](#), superintendent of taxes, Kokrajhar told that they carried out search operation operation since yesterday night and able to detect the busses which were brought goods instead of passengers.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrrwmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
