

Three more officers arrested in APSC scam

Two more officers have surrendered before police who have stepped up the crackdown against the accused officers in the APSC scam while police have arrested another in this connection whom the court have sent to police custody for 14 days.

Kamal Debbath, Dilip Kalita have surrendered before the police on Thursday while Jyotirmoy Nath has been arrested from Karimganj. A special court on Thursday evening remanded the trio to 14 days police custody for interrogation.

With this, the police team probing the nefarious scam have arrested altogether 18 officers while operation is going on to arrest three ACS officers namely Rajarshi Sen Deka, Gitali Doley and Sunayana Aideu who have gone underground before the police [launched](#) the massive crackdown.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.



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
