

Tight security in Nagaland for polls



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KOHIMA: A massive security arrangement is in place in [Nagaland](#) as the north eastern [state](#) is going to the assembly polls on February 28. Official sources confirmed in [Kohima](#) that the the Centre is prepared to dispatch 281 companies of security apart from the [state](#) police. These central forces are arriving [soon](#) to help the [state](#) ensure free and fair polls.

According to the [state](#) election department, 77 central forces have already landed in the poll bound [state](#) while others are likely to arrive in a day or two. A round-the-clock vigil is in place at the police check-posts to [deal](#) with the cash and arms movement apart from liquor [deal](#). "The remaining central forces are arriving after the end of the polling in [Tripura](#) slated for February 18," said a government officer.

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
