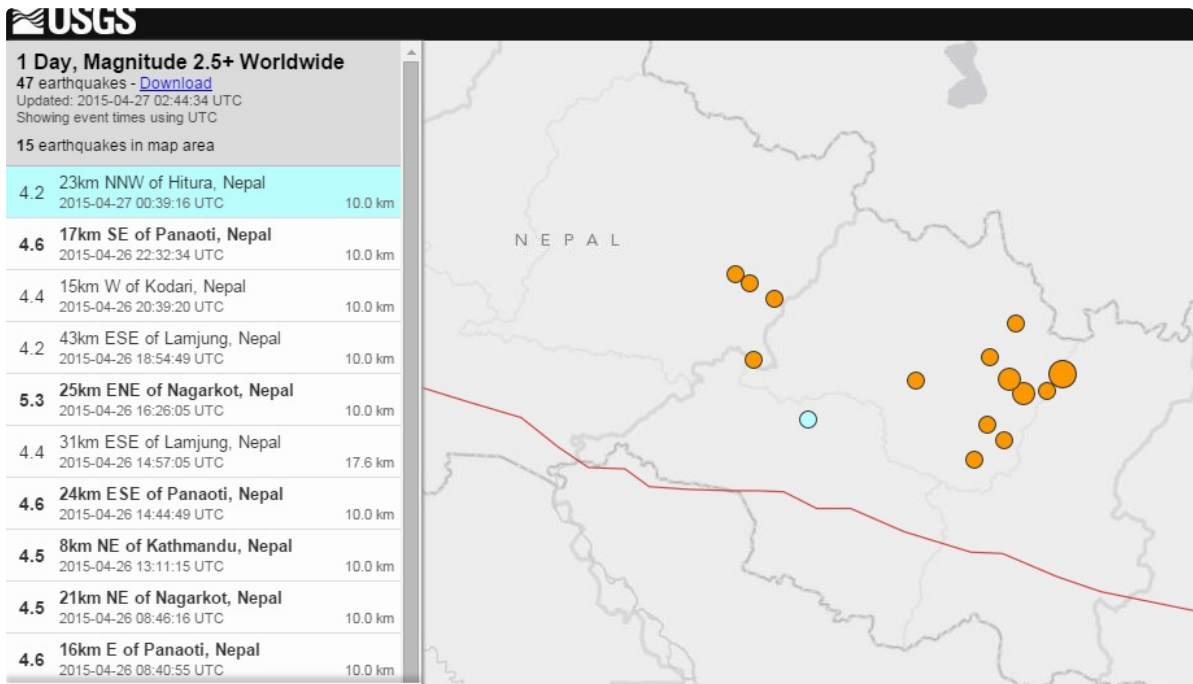


Time for relief and rescue
