

Tinsukia tense: Former rebel held after attack on illegal settlers

Amid a simmering tension, the [Tinsukia](#) police have arrested a [group](#) of former [ULFA](#) rebels hours after they allegedly led a [group](#) of people who set afire three [huts](#) belonging to a couple of alleged illegal settlers at a remote hamlet in Burhidihing area.

According to information, former [ULFA](#) rebel accompanied by some local residents reached set on fire three [huts](#) moments after the people who lived in managed to flee.
