

Trafficker held



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In a major achievement during routine patrolling troops of 37 Bn SSB Mangaldai deployed at BOP [Samrang](#) along the Indo-Bhutan border villages under [Udalguri](#) apprehended a person on Monday evening alleged to be involved in heinous human trafficking business.
