

ULFA likely to resume armed struggle

Will the pro-talk [ULFA leaders](#) resume the armed struggle? They might not do it. If so why they are so angry? Yes, they might pull out of the peace process. The [ULFA](#) men who came overground for talks on Wednesday threatened to resume armed struggle alleging Centre's lack of seriousness.

Talking to Assam Talks after a crucial meeting in Jagiroad, pro talk [ULFA leader](#) Mrinal Hazarika said that the they have not received anything positive from the NDA government. Hazarika said, "the Centre has done precious little to resolve problem. [New Delhi](#) lacks seriousness to bring Anup Chetia back from Dhaka who has been languishing in jail for the last several years along with three other [leaders](#)."

The former [ULFA](#) crack unit [leader](#) observed that if the Centre continues to play this delaying tactics then they will have no option but to resume the armed strike in a big way. Led by chairman Arabinda Rajkhowa, the pro talk [ULFA leaders](#) held three rounds of talks during the UPA government. Since NDA came to power they held only a round of talks with the Centre where any [sign](#) of solution has eluded.

KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026 — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

Hamkoshar Parishista is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.



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
