

ULFA shies away, KLNLF votes in Karbi Anglong

For the first time, the United Liberation Front of Asom (ULFA) has not urged the people to participate in the election. But only threatened to target the Congress accusing the ruling party of splitting the outfit. The overground cadres of ULFA have not exercised their franchise in the Assam Assembly polls.
