

Uriam Ghat: CM writes to Modi



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Chief Minister Tarun [Gogoi](#) asked for Prime Minister Narendra [Modi](#)'s personal intervention to restore peace in [Uriamghat](#) along the boiling [Assam-Nagaland border](#).
