

UYDF demands establishments of gardens of ITIs, parks for youths



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KOKRAJHAR: The United Youth's Democratic Federation ([UYDF](#)), a newly floated non-political social organisation have placed [demands](#) of establishments of gardens of Industrial Training Institutes([ITI](#)) and parks as well many more entrepreneurship in the country to make youths employers, and not employees.
