

## Waiting for mercury respite

There is some sort of respite in store from sweltering heat wave across the state on Thursday if the weathermen are to be believed.

The disrupting mercury is likely to come down towards the evening as there is some possibility of rainfall and thunderstorm in some parts of the state during the next 12 hours.

The Regional Meteorological Centre at Borjhar has forecast of change in weather during the next 12 hours as the depression in the Bay of Bengal would be partially [over](#) paving the way for incursion of moisture to Assam and its neighbouring north eastern states during the next 12 hours.

Wednesday morning started at 29 degree Celsius and the figure is likely to go up to 37 degree Celsius.

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## ABSU burns copies of 'Hamkoshar Parishista' over Bodo script issue

**KOKRAJHAR, September 22, 2026** — The All Bodo Students' Union (ABSU) on Tuesday burnt copies of a book titled *Hamkoshar Parishista* during protests held at several locations across Assam, including Gauhati University, objecting to what it described as the use of the Assamese script to represent the Bodo language.

*Hamkoshar Parishista* is a multilingual appendix containing learning resources for indigenous languages of Assam, including Bodo, Rabha, Mising and Karbi.

During the protests, ABSU members alleged that Bodo has been represented in the publication using the Assamese script instead of Devanagari, the script used for Bodo.

The organisation asserted that Bodo is recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution of India and is an Associate Official Language of Assam. ABSU demanded that Bodo be represented in its recognised script in educational and learning resources.

ABSU president Khwrmmdao Wary said the use of the Assamese script to represent Bodo in the publication was disrespectful to the Bodo language and literature.

He said Bodo is an Associate Official Language of Assam and a language recognised under the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Wary demanded the immediate withdrawal of the publication in its present form and called for the use of the Devanagari script for Bodo in the book.
