

Warning to fishery minister

The people of Raha, in Nagaon district have warned the State Fishery minister Noorjamal Sarkar against his decision to transfer the Fishery College based at Raha, established on March 7 in 1988, in Nagaon to Biswanaath Chariali in Sonitpur district. The minister who visited the college on November 3, made his decision clear before the college authority and asked them to join him in this mission despite of the uninterested mood of the authority. In support of his decision the minister reasoned the recent flood which caused little damage to the Profs. residents, students' hostels and academic offices of the college.
